B: Course Description & Objectives

Course Description:

"General English" concentrates on the development of reading skills, specially skills pertinent to students in a university environment; aspects of information retrieval, specifying the subject or purpose of a text, using context to infer meaning of words, phrases and large text segments. The focus is also on writing clear sentences and answers to questions of a general nature and utilizing context clues in understanding order and sequencing information.
